REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION
(Annex B-F Regulations)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel club Rule A11.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of the Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of the exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding providing that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

This paragraph does not apply to dogs in Obedience Classes, Working Trials or Agility Tests. Hints and Tips for Grooming Pyreneans

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

(The word “Dog” includes both sexes.) Puppies under 6 calendar months are not eligible for entry at this show. In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which counts towards the title of Champion shall be five point green stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries i. e. 5th September 2016 shall be counted when entering for a class. Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering in Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A variety class is one in which more than one breed or variety of a breed can compete. A First prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options.

(1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F(1)9(j) & 20.

(2) Transfer

(a) If a dog is ineligible for the class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age, but under 12 calendar months of age or 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class to the Open Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if this is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

NOTE: No dog is eligible for entry at a limited show which has won a Challenge Certificate or obtained an award which counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club (N.B. Reserves CCs do not make a dog ineligible)

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the Show.

SPECIAL YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won three or more first prizes at any Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy or Special Puppy Classes excepted whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won four or more first prizes at Open or Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won five or more first prizes at Open or Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not won seven or more first prizes at Open or Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

VETERAN: For all dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show.

PEGGY HOUSTON MEMORIAL STAKES: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show. Dogs declared BIS, RBIS, BOS & BP may not compete.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 10.00 a.m.
 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
 3. Judging will commence at 11.00 a.m. PROMPT.
 4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed.
 5. The use of cooking Stoves is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
 6. Entry Fees: Members First Entry with each dog £5.00, all subsequent entries with the same dog is free. Not for competition £1.00. Membership £9.00 Joint, £8.00 Single, 50p Junior. Catalogues: Ordered and paid with entry £2.00. On the day £2.50
 7. The amount of prize money on offer at this show is £15.00
 8. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
 11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW** - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy, it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best in Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will automatically be Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively.
- Withdrawal from Competition** - Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition for Best puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- Proviso** For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten is Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team, or a special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

12. **BEST IN SHOW** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

Withdrawal from other Competition—Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes and Best of Breed, prior to the Competition for Best in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The Dog declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten is Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team, or a special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that the exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not having been completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.

14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F– Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for exhibition.

16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17. The Committee will be empowered to exclude, or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from illness, disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place either before or after judging the entry fee will be forfeited.

18. It should be distinctly understood by exhibitors and purchasers of dogs at the Show and all other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of, or damage to dogs or any other property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others. It is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.

19. Should the Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.

20. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance.

21. Should any question arise which is not provided for in these regulations the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.

22. Any cost incurred from dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor Concerned.

23. All exhibitors are reminded that any dog present at the Show must be entered either in a class or not for competition. (Puppies over 5 months of age may be entered NFC). All dogs must be under control. Any dog deemed to be aggressive and out of control may be subject to exclusion from future shows.

24. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days**—Kennel Club Show Schedule Notice

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade—take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog (s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

DOG FOULING: Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to clear up any fouling by their dogs. There will be a marked exercise area so please make use of it.

Failure to clear up when requested to do so will be reported to the Kennel Club.

DIRECTIONS TO THE SHOW AT NEW HAW

Coming from the M25 Junction 11 (Chertsey/Woking)

- *Leave the M25 at junction 11 and follow the signs for Addlestone (A318).
- *Follow the dual carriageway until you come to a large roundabout –take the last exit.
- *Return to the dual carriageway...signposted to Addlestone/Byfleet (A318).
- *Continue on this road ... straight across 2 mini roundabouts...then straight through 2 sets of traffic lights...past Black Horse pub.
- *About 1 mile further on you will come to a car showroom on your left and past The White Hart pub. Straight across mini roundabout towards Woodham/Woking.
- *There is a road on left called Common Lane and row of cottages and then some shops (which lay back from road). At the end of shops is car park (left) for New Haw.

Coming from the A3 Junction 10 M25

- *Come off at junction 10 and take A3 towards London.
- *Leave at Cobham exit and take A245 towards Byfleet.
- *Straight through next set of traffic lights. About 1 mile on you pass by the turning for Silvermere Golf Course and come to a roundabout-continue straight on.
- *At the next roundabout turn right-following signs to Brooklands Superstores.
- *You will come to a roundabout-turn left past stores, straight across at mini roundabout.
- *About 1 mile down road there is a railway bridge controlled by traffic lights...continue until you go over canal bridge-keep left.
- *Turn left at mini roundabout towards Woodham/Woking. Continue as above.
